#### What is USA-Interns?



The Steuben-Schurz-Gesellschaft e.V. (SSG), Germany's oldest German-American friendship organization, has been dedicated to promoting cultural understanding between the peoples of Germany and

the United States for over 60 years.

In 1999, in an effort to strengthen the relations between the youths of both countries, the SSG established the **USA-Interns** program. This internship program provides German and American university students with the opportunity to work and live abroad. Our program allows our participants to gain first-hand insights into culture, history, work environment and daily life of the host country.

## The Participants

The German students doing an internship in the USA come from all disciplines and

- have successfully passed their first semester with good marks,
- are working towards their B.A., M.A., Ph.D. degree,
- speak good English, and
- have successfully completed at least one field related internship, thus ensuring that you receive an academically and professionally qualified coworker.

Beyond past academic and professional achievements, the students embody the aims of our program and will capably serve as ambassadors promoting relations between Germany and the USA both during their internship and upon their return.

### The Internships

There is a great demand for internships in the USA ranging across all sectors including business, international relations, engineering, media/ PR, administration, etc. in both the non-profit and for-profit sectors.

The internships typically

- have a duration of 2-3 months (but also 6 months and longer, variable)
- take very often place during the summer vacation
- allow the student to experience the everyday work involved in that particular field and to put theory into practice while learning new methods and practical approaches to real work-related challenges

Our program also emphasizes that the student should gain insight into how individuals communicate and work with one another in a different country.

## The Role of Participating Companies

Our interns are independent and self-sufficient individuals, who have proven themselves able to tackle the challenges of living overseas on their own.

As the host of one of our interns, your responsibility is to organize the internship and learning experience within your company/institution. A mentor should assist the students when they have questions and advise them during their stay to guarantee the best learning environment possible.

Because the costs surrounding an internship in the USA are considerable for the student, any financial assistance you can provide is greatly appreciated.

The students are responsible for organizing the logistics of their stay including the flight, arrival, housing, and matters surrounding every day life. Any information you can provide on finding housing, i.e. through company accommodations or a list of tips on finding housing in the area is warmly welcome.

#### The Placement Procedure

The USA-Interns coordinator collects the applications and conducts a preliminary selection following an intensive interview process in Frankfurt. Selected applications are then forwarded to you based upon the profile that you provided to us, thus ensuring that the applicants you receive match your company's needs.

Each company is free to interview the applicants personally via telephone and to choose the individual who best suits their needs.

Upon selecting a candidate, an offer is sent to the student. Once the offer is accepted, the student begins with the preparations for his/her stay abroad.

The USA-Interns coordination office is there to provide any assistance that you might need during the entire process.

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
